Veterinary Technician


If you choose to become a vet tech, the kinds of duties you perform on a daily basis will depend on the type of facility you work in, but you'll always be assisting vets in caring for animal patients. Your duties will likely encompass a wide array of tasks, from keeping medical records to administering shots and medication. General tasks could include:

- Observing animal patients for changes in behavior
- Preparing animals for exams or surgery
- Giving animals nursing care or first aid
- Collecting and test lab samples
- Taking and developing X-rays
- Giving medications, shots, or treatments
- Collecting and maintaining patient records

The Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources cluster is about the production, processing, marketing, distribution, financing and development of agricultural commodities and resources including food, fiber, wood products, natural resources, horticulture, and other plant and animal products/resources. The increased emphasis on producing clean energy is creating new opportunities for farmers to grow plants and grains that can be used in biofuels. Farm advisors apply research to solve problems and issues related to agriculture and agriculture-related processes. Agriculture and forestry account for more than 414,700 jobs in Virginia. Engineering and technical occupations, including environmental engineers, veterinary technicians, and conservation scientists, are anticipated to see strong job growth.







Architecture & Construction

The Architecture and Construction cluster is about careers in designing, planning, managing, building and maintaining the built environment. Think about your home, school, or local retail center. Careers in this cluster are responsible for the details of designing, constructing, and equipping these buildings. That ranges from the architects designing the look and flow of the building, to the carpenters and masons building its walls, to the electricians and installers of heating and air conditioning. Architects with knowledge of sustainable, or green, design will be especially in demand. The construction industry is projected to account for about 225,000 jobs across Virginia in the next five years.



Plumber

Plumbers read blueprints, drawings and specifications to determine the layout of plumbing systems, water supply networks and waste and drainage systems. Plumbers work in cooperation with other trades and laborers to ensure that all specifications, legislation and policies are met, and to ensure efficient completion of any project.

The Plumber will then plan, install, and service plumbing systems, fixtures, piping equipment and controls. These piping systems may be used to transport:

- Water
- Waste
- Gases
- Hot liquids



Web Designer

Web design is a relatively new industry, having been created with the advent of the Internet, and is gaining popularity in particular over the last ten years, as digital media has become a major part of many people's lives. Most people rely on the web for their communications, information, shopping, social life and more. The demand for web designers has been growing rapidly and the industry is currently considered a good one with relation to job prospects and future growth.

- Meet with internal stakeholders or external clients to discuss objectives for Internet and intranet sites and other online projects
- Provide expert creative guidance on the overall look, feel and functionality of web design projects
- Create concepts in design programs such as Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator
- Know languages such as HTML and JavaScript
- Create compelling artwork (including images, icons, banners) and layouts that are appealing and user-friendly
- Conduct quality assurance work to identify possible problems before launch

m T}$ he Arts, A/V Technology and Communications cluster is about flexing your creativity, design, writing, performing, and multimedia skills. Over the next decade, the Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications cluster is expected to experience lower-than-average occupational employment growth (2%) compared to the Commonwealth as a whole (9%). It is important to keep in mind, however, that many individuals with careers in this cluster are self-employed and thus not captured in these statistics. Prepare for careers from graphic design to broadcast journalism through a focus on advanced technologies used in venues including corporate boardrooms, hotels and convention centers, classrooms, and museums. Technical writers, also called technical communicators, are responsible for helping others understand complex technical information or how to use technology products and their employment is expected to increase. Growth and changes in technology and electronics in the home and workplace will increase demand for technical writers. Photographers should see job prospects grow. Selfemployed photographers will increase due to demands from individuals wishing to have portraits taken and corporations seeking photographs for marketing materials. Career prospects for producers and directors are expected to increase as a result of new content delivery methods – such as watching TV online or on a mobile device – and the popularity of reality television.



Business Management & Administration

Business Management and Administration careers use your organizational and leadership skills to prepare for careers where you plan, direct and evaluate operations to run a successful business. There are a variety of career opportunities available including hiring staff, analyzing data and launching your own start-up. This career cluster employs the largest number of workers in Virginia.

Management Analyst

Management analysts, often called management consultants, propose ways to improve an organization's efficiency. They advise managers on how to make organizations more profitable through reduced costs and increased revenues. Management analysts travel frequently to meet with clients. Employment of management analysts is projected to grow 14 percent from 2014 to 2024, much faster than the average for all occupations. Demand for the services of these workers should grow as organizations continue to seek ways to improve efficiency and control costs.

- Interview personnel and conduct on-site observation to ascertain unit functions, work performed, and methods, equipment, and personnel used
- Plan study of work problems and procedures, such as organizational change, communications, information flow, integrated production methods, inventory control, or cost analysis
- Analyze data gathered and develop solutions or alternative methods of proceeding

Middle School Teacher


Middle school teachers educate students typically in sixth through eighth grade. Middle school teachers help students build on the fundamentals taught in elementary school and prepare students for the more difficult curriculum they will face in high school. Middle school teachers typically do the following:

- Plan lessons that teach students a subject, such as biology and history
- Assess students to evaluate their abilities, strengths, and weaknesses
- Teach lessons they have planned to an entire class or to smaller groups
- Grade students' assignments to monitor their progress
- Communicate with parents about their child's progress
- Work with students individually to help them overcome specific learning challenges
- Prepare students for standardized tests required by the state
- Develop and enforce classroom rules
- Supervise students outside of the classroom—for example, at lunchtime or during detention

The Education and Training cluster is about using your ability to motivate and your love of people to provide education and training that reaches individuals of all ages and across a range of industries. Careers include teaching in a classroom, leading as a college president and serving in your community as a social worker. During this time period a number of older teachers are expected to retire, which is expected to improve job prospects for younger educators. The increased emphasis on early childhood education is also driving the demand for preschool teachers.







Energy

Careers in the energy industry relate to extracting or harnessing power from a variety of sources, refining it and distributing it, and ensuring its safe use by consumers. With vast supplies of natural resources and ever-improving technologies, the United States is a global leader in the production of energy. Non-renewable energy sources include oil and natural gas, nuclear, and coal.

- Oil and natural gas account for nearly 60% of current energy production.
- The exploration and extraction of shale and deep-water resources has led to growth in this field with many jobs in western states or off-shore areas.
- Renewable energy sources include solar, wind, hydroelectric, and biomass.
- Experts predict increasing shifts to "green" energy in the coming decades to meet ever-growing demand.
- Technology advances will make renewables more cost effective.
- The safe distribution of electricity is another vital aspect of the energy industry. Different energy sources may be used to generate electrical power for both business and home needs

Inspect, diagnose, adjust, or repair wind turbines. Perform maintenance on wind turbine equipment including resolving electrical, mechanical, and hydraulic malfunctions.

Your day might include things like:

- Troubleshoot equipment or systems operation problems.
- Repair green energy equipment or systems.
- Maintain work equipment or machinery.
- Test electrical circuits or components for proper functioning.
- Test mechanical equipment to ensure proper functioning.
- Climb equipment or structures to access work areas.
- Maintain inventories of materials, equipment, or products.
- Test mechanical systems to ensure proper functioning.
- Test electrical equipment or systems to ensure proper functioning.
- Train others in operational procedures.
- Measure equipment outputs.
- Inspect mechanical equipment to locate damage, defects, or wear.


Business Banker

Business bankers work in a financial institution and manage a business loan portfolio that may include small and/or large organizations. They perform careful analysis of prospective clients' needs and best options, working with the client to determine optimal banking solutions. In addition, business bankers are in charge of communicating with current clients to ensure all needs are being met and questions are answered. Individuals in this position may also need to negotiate and set terms for loans.

Other activities may include:

- Analyzing banking and loan transactions for new and existing clients
- Delivering the best financial return on investments
- Actively monitoring and managing banking relationships to ensure that client goals and objectives are met
- Assessing client needs and proposing useful solutions that deliver positive financial results Identifying, engaging, and welcoming new clients into the bank family





Government & Public Administration

he Government and Public Administration cluster is about using your passion for public service to prepare to work in a diverse array of jobs found in local, state and federal government. Virtually every occupation can be found within this field. You may help protect our country, represent our interests abroad, or pass and enforce laws. Employment of financial examiners is expected to grow due to the increase in financial regulations. Interpreters and translators should see job growth due to increasing globalization, including immigration and international trade. Those who speak frequently translated languages, such as French and Spanish, will see the most demand for jobs. Hiring of real estate appraisers and assessors is expected to increase driven by population increases and economic expansion, which are expected to increase the need for property.



Interpreter & Translator

Interpreters and translators aid communication by converting messages or text from one language into another language. Although some people do both, interpreting and translating are different professions: interpreters work with spoken communication, and translators work with written communication. Interpreters convert information from one spoken language into another—or, in the case of sign language interpreters, between spoken language and sign language. The goal of an interpreter is to have people hear the interpretation as if it were the original language. Interpreters usually must be fluent speakers or signers of both languages, because

they communicate back and forth among people who do not share a common language.

- Convert concepts in the source language to equivalent concepts in the target language
- Compile information and technical terms into glossaries and terminology databases to be used in translations
- Speak, read, and write fluently in at least two languages, one of which is English
- Relay the style and tone of the original language
- Render spoken messages accurately, quickly, and clearly

Diagnostic Medical Sonographer


Want to work with really high tech machinery? The most common question this person gets is: "Is it a boy or a girl?" They also work with doctors to diagnose other conditions. Sonographers, also called ultrasound technicians and diagnostic medical sonographers, use ultrasound high frequency sound waves to produce images of internal body tissues. This helps doctors diagnose and monitor a variety of conditions such as heart disease, pregnancy and cancer.

They work in:

- Hospitals
- Physicians' offices
- Imaging clinics
- Medical and diagnostic laboratories

Health care is one the fastest growing labor markets in the world. There are a lot of careers in health science other than doctors and nurses. The Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that this area of health and medical sciences will grow by 39% in the next five years with median annual wage of \$65,860. You can start your career in this field with an associate's degree and certification.





Hospitality & Tourism

Hospitality & Tourism encompasses the management, marketing, and operations of restaurants and other food services, lodging, attractions, recreation events and travel related services. Jobs in this career cluster include travel agents who help people plan their ideal vacation, and chefs and bakers who prepare their own culinary masterpieces. Competition in this field is fierce. Employment of meeting, convention, and event planners is expected to grow rapidly as companies become increasingly widespread and are looking for opportunities to bring their employees together. Job seekers with a college degree in hospitality management or administration will have the best prospects. Virginia tourism generated approximately \$21.5 billion in revenue and supported 213,000 jobs in 2013.

Meeting, Convention, and Event Planner

Event planning is more than good food, pretty decor and entertainment, and a full guest list. An event planner creates, organizes, and supervises each element of an event, convention, or meeting. The responsibility to confirm and coordinate every last detail falls on the event planner. While movies might depict the event planner at an event in full control and troubleshooting problems, the reality is that the majority of the work is done months beforehand. This career offers a creative, organized, and multitasking individual an exciting and always unique opportunity. This field is expected to grow 33% in the next five years.

- Plan, design, and produce events while managing all project delivery elements within time limits
- Conduct market research, gather information, and negotiate contracts prior to closing any deals
- Organize facilities and manage all event details
- Provide coordination for catering, entertainment, transportation, location, special guests, & promotional materials
- Ensure compliance with insurance, legal, health, and safety obligations




Emergency Room Social Worker

Are you calm under pressure? Do you want to support people in crisis? When most people think of social workers, they think of child safety and custody issues, welfare recipients and the mentally ill, but Emergency Room (ER) Social Worker training encompasses much more. Because any person can end up in the ER, these social workers have to be prepared for almost anything. They perform psychiatric and suicide evaluations to decide if it is safe for a patient to be discharged. They do stress evaluations and death notifications. They counsel victims of violent crimes, substance abusers and the families of dead or dying patients. In addition to these responsibilities, the ER social worker performs countless tasks, small and large, which aren't in any job description and often involve last minute improvisation. More accurately, everything that isn't medical and that needs to get done is left for these specialized social workers to do.

Human Services cluster is projected to experience about 16 percent growth in Virginia between 2014 and 2024. The Human Services cluster uses your skills to provide support to families and individuals with services from working in early childhood care to providing mental health services for older adults. This diverse Career Cluster allows you to work in a variety of settings including health care, spas, schools, and community centers. It is expected that more social workers will be needed in the coming years. There should be an even greater need for mental health and substance abuse social workers. The massage therapy industry also should see a boost in workers.






Information Technology

The Information Technology cluster uses your love of technology to learn how to design, develop, and manage different types of software and hardware programs. Though this field requires a solid foundation in math and science as well as strong technical skills, there are careers in information technology in virtually every part of the economy.

Support Technician, Information Technology

Support technicians maintain computers, network servers and phone technology in business settings. They often work with the hardware, repairing or replacing defective equipment. They install new equipment or upgraded software and conduct testing on new or current software. Support technicians may be responsible for diagnosing problems in computer hardware and may be called upon to troubleshoot problems for users. Support technicians collect outdated equipment for recycling or disposal and will usually be the people responsible for installing new computers and attaching peripheral equipment such as printers.

Other activities include:

- Installing, updating, and repairing software on organization systems
- Tracking and monitoring day-today performance of systems, and conducting analysis with the goal of improving performance
- Responding to requests for new or configured hardware or software, and keeping inventory up to date
- Troubleshooting hardware and software problems, logging problems and documenting fixes




Crime Scene Investigator

Crime Scene Investigators typically walk the scene of a crime searching for useful evidence such as fingerprints, hairs, or fibers, for later analysis at a crime lab. Attention to detail and critical thinking are essential skills. Additionally, crime scene techs will witness a range of crime scenes, including those following violent crimes, so a strong stomach is critical.

- Schedules may include night and/ or weekend shifts
- May work in an office or laboratory setting, outside in all types of locations and conditions, or both
- Need to work well as a team member & possess excellent communication skills

The Law, Public Safety, Corrections and Security cluster is about planning, managing, and providing legal, public safety, protective services and homeland security, including professional and technical support services. The justice system is a complex field that employs many people to keep communications safe. This cluster offers great careers for people who want to give back to their community. Police officers, emergency medical technicians, and firefighters are vital for citizen's security. This cluster also encompasses the legal field. Demand for emergency medical technicians and paramedics should increase by nearly 50 percent by 2022



Manufacturing

he Manufacturing cluster is about planning, managing and performing the processing of materials into intermediate or final products and related professional and technical support activities such as production planning and control, maintenance and manufacturing/process engineering. Today, highly automated manufacturing requires extremely technical skills. Employers continue to need machinists as they purchase new equipment, modify production techniques, and implement design changes more rapidly. Industrial machinery mechanics and maintenance workers are needed as the use of sophisticated manufacturing machinery requires proper maintenance. The Quality Assurance and Maintenance, Installation and Repair pathways are projected to employ 103,600 Virginians.



Machinist

This is where the hands-on training of the technical world meets the math and science world. Machinists set up and operate mechanically-controlled and computer-controlled machine tools to modify parts or produce precision metal parts, tools, and instruments. The industry continues to innovate and upgrade to automated technology but machinists are needed to set up, monitor, and maintain the systems.

- Operate machine tools such as lathes, milling machines, and grinders to produce metal parts
- Review electronic or written blueprints or specifications for a job
- Shape steel, aluminum, titanium, plastic, silicon and other materials
- Plan the sequence of cutting and finishing operations
- Use manual and computer-controlled machinery



Marketing

Visual merchandiser

Visual merchandisers use their design skills to help promote the image, products and services of businesses and other organizations. Visual merchandisers usually focus on designing displays, stands and panels which are used at exhibitions, conferences and other events. They also produce point-of-sale displays, which are stock containers that are usually mass-produced and installed in hundreds of retail outlets.

Other activities may include:

- Promoting the image, products and services of businesses and other organizations.
- Designing displays, stands and panels for exhibitions, conferences and other events.
- Creating point-of-sale displays (which are installed in hundreds of retail outlets).
- Researching to get an understanding of what is needed, and coming up with design ideas.
- Purchasing elements such as lighting, props and accessories.
- Making the most of the space available, working within a budget and meeting deadlines.

Installing and dismantling displays may also be part of the job description.

The Marketing cluster flexes your creative skills for a career in advertising, public relations, sales, or planning. This Career Cluster will prepare you to work on projects such as promotional campaigns, event planning and new sales techniques.

All areas of scientific research (e.g., physical science, social science, engineering) need workers to possess advanced technology skills and have in depth knowledge in math and science. Job opportunities in these clusters will vary depending upon specialty. Over the next decade, jobs aligned with advancing technology are predicted to boom as new career opportunities open.




Animation

The world of animation can be in 2D, 3D model making, stop frame, or computer animation. While the basic animation skill continues to be the centered around the artistic ability of the animator, it is becoming a more technical and computer-driven occupation. Producing an animation involves many stages and processes. This can include generating ideas in the development stage, to building models during production, and editing the final piece in post-production. Each stage can involve several specific tasks carried out by different people. For example:

- Directors and producers create ideas, plan the project, and find funding
- Production designers create the look
- Storyboard artists take the script or ideas and show the story in a visual way
- Layout artists draw how each shot will look
- Digital painters fill in the lines
- Editors add the soundtrack and produce the finished piece



Mechanics are laborers that are highly skilled in maintaining or operating machinery, motors, engines, etc. The demand for mechanics is growing as people are driving cars longer and equipment becomes more sophisticated. Businesses, however, report having difficulty finding workers with the right skills!

- Inspects machinery for defects
- Completes preventive maintenance
- Repairs mechanical and electrical systems malfunctions
- Checks equipment for damage, record hours used, mileage and fuel levels
- Greets customers and assists with customer inquiries

he Transportation, Distribution and Logistics cluster is about planning, management and movement of people, materials and goods by road, pipeline, air, rail and water and related support services dealing with infrastructure, logistics, equipment, and facilities. Highly skilled automotive mechanics should have an easy time finding a job since people are driving their cars longer than they used to. The need for truck drivers will increase as the demand for goods increases. Formal postsecondary automotive training may help some candidates find jobs as automotive technicians and service professionals.


